




Today's Student Veterans...

Student veterans have higher academic performance (GPA) compared to traditional students




Student Veteran Average

Today's Student Veterans...

- Roughly half are married or in a domestic partnership
- Over half have children and nearly 20 percent of those consider themselves single parents
- Two-thirds work full- or part-time while in school
- More than 60 percent are first generation college students
- More likely to be Black or Hispanic
- More than 70 percent have a disability
- The vast majority attend public or private not-for-profit universities
- Over half of enlisted veterans did so to earn the G.I. Bill to pay for college







To fully understand service to veterans, we must develop a comparable group for analysis.



 - For veterans, this means participation in the 8 Keys for Veteran Success



WHO IS STUDENT VETERANS OF AMERICA









Went straight to college, and got her B.A. in 2005

Started earning immediately and saving for retirement. **TWIN B:** Graduated high school in 2000, top 10%

Enlisted in the Air Force and separated in 2006

Transitioned into college, starting in the fall of 2006

Graduated college and started earning and saving in 2011

It takes about 17 years for Twin B to catch back up to Twin A economically, even with higher earnings post college.

SVA Programs: The Leadership Continuum

Leadership Institute

Just prior to graduation, we invite the top one percent of chapter leaders to Washington, D.C. to participate in a foundational and transformative leadership development program designed to push student veterans into discovering their own identities as leaders as they move into the civilian workforce.

Washington Week

As an integral part of our advocacy work, student veterans join the SVA team in Washington, D.C. as we deliver our policy priorities to a joint meeting of the House and Senate Veteran Affairs Committees. Student veterans then meet with members of congress and their staff to discuss issues relevant to them and their chapters.



Regional Summits

At the end of every summer, we train new chapter leaders on the strategic planning and development of their chapter as well as deliver role-specific workshops with all leadership (officer) positions and advisors, providing an additional network for chapter leaders.

National Conference ("NatCon")

The academic year is bifurcated by the largest gathering of student veterans anywhere in the world meant to **train** chapters and stakeholders on salient topics, **convene** our network for the sharing of ideas and resources, and **reframe** the possible for student veterans given their experiences and the transformative power of education.



Advocacy in Washington, D.C.

Federal Legislative


Maintain and grow frequency of SVA subject matter expert testimony, grow relationships with individual member offices and committees, grow participation in the Policy Liaison Program (PLP), and host roundtables and briefings to further influence federal policy.

Federal Executive

Maintain open-door engagement with the White House leading through to next administration. Deepen agency relationships. Add program-specific engagements with executive branch via Leadership Institute, Washington Week, VFW-SVA Legislative Fellowship, and more.

Campus

Support chapters and campuses through roundtable discussions, grassroots advocacy, 'peer champions', and strengthen student government relationships and influence across the network.





Advocacy in Washington, D.C.

Issues


SVA advocates for GI Bill improvements, post-traditional student success, VA modernization, strengthening higher education, and transparency and accountability.

Legislative

Top legislative priorities include protecting access to VA education benefits by addressing policies leading to unnecessary administrative burdens on institutions, updating MHA to better serve today's student veterans, and expanding access to VA healthcare on campuses through the VA VITAL Program. This year, SVA has already testified three times before the House and Senate Committees on Veterans' Affairs.

Regulatory


SVA is active in the regulatory process engaging in negotiations, responding to requests for information, and submitting public comment on regulatory matters at the Department of Education, Department of Veterans Affairs, and other federal agencies.





Research on behalf of all Veterans

- ✓ Data collection and success tracking


